#### Dear Mayor Newhard:

Barton & Loguidice, D.P.C. (B&L) is pleased to provide the Village of Warwick with this scope of services to prepare a Preliminary Engineering Report (PER) for the Wastewater Treatment Plant (WWTP). The purpose of this project is to prepare a report and assist in preparation of supporting documents necessary for development of funding applications for improvement of the Village's WWTP. It is our understanding that preparation of the actual grant application will be by the Village's grant writer, and that B&L's role will be to provide the technical support documents as described in this proposal.

#### Background

The Village WWTP last underwent a major upgrade in 1990 when the plant converted the main biological treatment process from trickling filters to rotating biological contactors. Several smaller projects have been undertaken since 1990, namely conversion of the gravity thickener to an aerobic digester and modifications to the liquid chlorine disinfection system.

The Village is currently in the process of upgrading the disinfection system to ultraviolet disinfection in response to a SPDES discharge permit modification. This work will be completed by February 2019.

In 2017, the Village hired B&L to complete a feasibility study to evaluate the rotating biological contactors, and provide recommendations with respect to capital improvements for these units.

When the initial site investigation was conducted several other treatment processes were identified as having deficiencies and these processes were also assessed as part of the feasibility study. The advantages and disadvantages of alternative biological treatment processes were also identified but not evaluated in detail at that time.

The capital costs for the necessary improvements are significant and the Village is embarking upon the process to secure funding to move forward with necessary capital improvements over the next several years to provide a facility capable of meeting the needs of the Village over the next 20 plus years.

#### **Scope of Services**

B&L will prepare a Preliminary Engineering Report (PER) in accordance with New York State Environmental Facilities Corporation (EFC) requirements with the intent to list a recommended project in the 2019 CWSRF Intended Use Plan (IUP) for CWSRF funding. Other funding options the Village should consider include the NYSEFC Water Infrastructure Improvement Act (WIIA) program, and the

NYSDEC's Water Quality Improvement Program (WQIP) through the Consolidated Funding Application (CFA) program.

The main focus of the PER and evaluations will be threefold:

- Evaluate future needs for wastewater treatment within the Village
- Determine if more stringent SPDES discharge requirements are anticipated in the future
- Analyze wastewater treatment technologies available to:
  - Upgrade the headworks (screening)
  - Upgrade the primary and biological treatment process (starting from primary clarifiers through the secondary clarifiers and associated pumping)
  - o Upgrade the tertiary filtration process
- Develop a capital plan to upgrade the facility including project schedule and budget

A portion of the work previously completed with respect to the RBC's will be updated and integrated into the PER. Historical data will be updated to include additional 2017 and 2018 data.

Based on the above, B&L proposes the following scope of services.

#### Scope of Service - Base Services

#### 1. Historical Data Review

B&L update the previously obtained historical data from the Village including, but not limited to:

- Operational records, reports and maps
- Annual sewer budget
- Performance data for the existing WWTP (mid 2017 to present)

#### 2. Establish Current and Future WWTP Design Flows and Loads

B&L will review and summarize the Discharge Monitoring Reports (DMRs, latest three (3) years) for the WWTP to estimate current average daily, maximum daily/monthly, peak hourly, and dry weather flows for the WWTP. Projected flows and loads for a 20-year planning period will be estimated based on input solicited from the Village to derive the design flows and loads for the improvements. If flows outside the Village are anticipated the additional flow can be included in the analysis but the conveyance of these flows to the Village collection system is not included in this PER.

#### 3. WWTP Effluent Parameters

B&L will schedule a conference call with the NYSDEC to discuss the issue of future SPDES permit requirements.

B&L will prepare a written request to NYSDEC Region 3 for a preliminary determination of effluent discharge parameters for the WWTP based on the proposed design flows/loads and given the likely improvements at the time and any pending new regulatory requirements. These

parameters, which will be the SPDES permit limits, will further narrow down what alternative unit processes are evaluated.

#### 4. Alternative WWTP Unit Process Evaluations

B&L will complete an alternatives analysis of several major unit process components. The evaluation will be coupled with an overall identification of needs and deficiencies throughout the WWTP. Additionally, the recommendations from the process evaluation will be incorporated into an overall recommendation of improvements for the facilities.

The evaluation will generally identify conceptual improvements for each alternative, analysis/impacts on the hydraulic profile, discuss constructability, identify life-cycle costs (including O&M and energy costs), compare the benefits of the evaluated alternatives, evaluate performance and reliability of the evaluated alternatives, and recommend an alternative based on all factors. B&L will solicit technical data, preliminary design, and equipment selection and obtain budgetary estimates from the various manufacturers' representatives. Alternatives will be evaluated in consideration of proposed design flows and loads and preliminary effluent discharge limits provided by the NYSDEC. Concept site plan and process flow diagrams will be prepared in support of alternative configurations.

The following major processes and alternatives are anticipated for evaluation using 10 States Standards, TR-16 and other industry design standards.

- 1. Headworks Facility, evaluate the following:
  - a. Installation of fine screen to remove inorganics.
  - b. Installation of a grit removal system, if hydraulically feasible.
  - c. Retrofit existing headworks pole barn structure vs. construction of a new structure.

#### 2. Biological Treatment Process, evaluate the following:

- a. Alternative Technology Assessment
  - Develop an overall comparison of treatment alternatives based on the information obtained from the NYSDEC with respect to pending SPDES discharge limits.
  - ii. Analysis will be the comparison of upgrading the existing biological treatment process to alternative treatment processes
  - iii. Alternative 1 will include a detailed analysis of the installation of Sequencing Batch Reactors with tertiary filtration
  - iv. Alternative 2 will include a detailed analysis of a membrane bioreactor (MBR), no additional tertiary filtration is required with that biological process
- b. Primary Settling Tank
  - i. Incorporate the information contained in the 2017 desktop evaluation into the PER.
- c. Rotating Biological Contactors
  - i. Incorporate the information contained in the 2017 desktop evaluation into the PER.
- d. Final Settling Tanks
  - i. Incorporate the information contained in the 2017 desktop evaluation into the PER.

#### 3. Tertiary Filtration - Evaluate the following:

- a. Two alternative tertiary filter systems will be evaluated.
- b. Impacts to the existing hydraulic profile will be analyzed to determine equipment

#### options

#### 4. Effluent Disinfection:

- a. A summary of the UV disinfection upgrade design will be included in the PER to accommodate the possibility that the construction costs associated with this project can be refinanced through EFC or other state agency program.
- b. The PER will include a short comparison of the proposed ultraviolet light disinfection system vs the existing liquid chlorination/dechlorination system

#### 5. Aerobic Digester and Dewatering Building - Evaluate the following:

- a. Identify building improvements to the Dewatering Building
- b. Evaluate if any improvements are necessary to the Aerobic Digester
- c. Evaluate if replacement sludge pumps are required

Assumption: As the Belt Filter Press has been recently replaced that unit process and associated components will not be evaluated as part of this PER.

- 6. Ancillary Improvements Evaluate the following ancillary support systems at the WWTP:
  - a. Site/Civil: Alternative site access road configuration to get to the Filtration Building
  - b. Other miscellaneous improvements that may be identified by the Village at the kick off meeting.

#### 5. Project Workshop No. 1

B&L will schedule and attend Project Workshop No. 1 to be held with the Village and invited Project Stakeholders to review the preliminary materials prepared under Tasks 1 through 4. The alternative scenarios and support documentation will be presented in a visual format and reviewed and discussed with the Village and Project Stakeholders.

A recommended alternative will be identified based on input from the Village and Project Stakeholders in advance of preparing the draft PER in task 8.

Task Deliverable: Workshop Meeting Notes

#### 6. Preliminary Estimates of Probable Project Capital, O&M Costs, and Short-Lived Assets

B&L will prepare preliminary estimates of probable project cost for each alternative process/WWTP technology to be evaluated for comparison of initial capital costs. Estimates will be based on competitively bidding the project in accordance with General Municipal and Wick's Law. Estimates will be developed using current Means Construction Cost Data, manufacturers' equipment budget quotes, and B&L's experience on recent projects of this nature. B&L will prepare estimates of annual (first year) O&M costs, including chemicals, electricity, labor, contractual services, sludge disposal, etc. B&L will also prepare a schedule of short-lived assets, which identify system components anticipated to need replacement within 5, 10 and 15 years, as required by USDA Rural Development.

#### 7. Financial Analysis

B&L will prepare a preliminary financial analysis to estimate annual debt service cost. CWSRF and Rural Development will be considered in the analysis as "base" funding sources, in addition to other potential grant/loan funding sources. Similarly, the estimated annual operation and maintenance charge and contribution to the short-lived asset reserve account will be calculated for connected users.

The services to be provided by Barton & Loguidice under this Agreement DO NOT INCLUDE advice or recommendations with respect to the issuance, structure, timing, terms or any other aspect of municipal securities, municipal derivatives, guaranteed investment contracts or investment strategies. #### 9. Project Workshop No. 2

B&L will schedule and attend Project Workshop No. 2 to be held with the Village and Project Stakeholders to review comments on the Draft PER and to discuss steps toward project implementation. The purpose of this workshop is to address any comments or concerns the Village may have prior to submitting a Final PER to regulatory authorities and/or funding agencies.

#### 10. Final Preliminary Engineering Report

Following Project Workshop No. 2 and considering the Village, and Project Stakeholders input, B&L will finalize the PER and submit a PDF copy for the Village's use and distribution to regulatory and funding agencies. B&L will then address any regulatory review comments on the Final PER, which will then serve as the basis for pursuing funding and project design.

#### 11. Funding Strategy/Assistance

Assist the Village Grant writer to provide technical engineering support for anticipated applications. Up to 8 hours of technical support services is budgeted for this task which may include conference calls, reviewing applications, developing project schedules etc.

#### 12. Planning Services - SEQR and SHPO

B&L will prepare a SEQR Long Form and assist the Village with the coordinated review process. It is assumed an Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) is not required.

Threatened and endangered species (T&E species) screening letters will be forwarded to the appropriate agencies. It is assumed that no field services will be required for the T&E species. We will also complete a desktop review of NYS and federal wetlands in the project area. No field services are proposed at this time.

It is assumed that a Phase 1A archeological assessment will be needed. B&L will subcontract this work to complete this literature study. It is anticipated that an archeological Phase 1B assessment including shovel tests will not be required. Additional services, if needed, would be provided under separate authorization if Phase 1B services are required.

#### Schedule

Based on a conversation with Kristopher LaPan at EFC on April 19, 2018, the solicitation for Water Infrastructure Improvements grants has not been released and they do not know the timing of that grant program this year or specific grant requirements.

If a timetable similar to the 2017 WIIA grant program is assumed then the following needs to be completed by late June 2018 (date to be established):

- Engineering Report in EFC format
- Environmental Review Documentation (SHPO/SEQR review)
- Smart Growth Assessment form
- Village Board Resolution (Certified)

To be listed on the Annual IUP for short and long term loan financing in 2019 the final Preliminary Engineering Report will need to be completed and submitted to EFC through the PLUS system no later than August 31, 2018 for listing in the IUP. The above items are needed as well as a bond resolution.

The NYSDEC WQIP program is part of the annual CFA program and it is anticipated that applications will be due in late July 2018.

#### Services Not Included

Additional services will be required to complete a capital improvement project (should the Village elect to do so), which are not part of this proposal. Tasks specifically not included are as follows:

- Topographic survey
- Subsurface investigations
- Design, bidding, permitting or construction related services

#### Fee Proposal

The fee for the Scope of Service presented above would be a lump sum fee of \$37,500 as follows:

PER preparation and funding application assistance (Tasks 1-10) \$27,500 Funding Assistance & Planning Services - SEQR and SHPO (Tasks 11-12) \$10,000

Note the allowance for the Phase 1A archeological study is \$6,000, which is part of the above noted \$10,000 Planning Services fee.

Billing would be monthly in proportion to the services completed through the date of the invoice. We will not bill beyond this amount without a change in scope and prior approval of the Village Board.







To the Village of Warwick Board of Trustees:

The Warwick Valley Prevention Coalition is planning a Walk to "Break the Stigma" associated with addiction recovery on Sunday, July 29th. The Walk will take place rain or shine. We will walk from the Warwick Valley Community Center following the attached route leaving at 10:00 am and assemble at Railroad Green at approximately 11am to 12 noon to hear speakers and celebrate recovery. While at the Railroad Green we will have a stage set up for the speakers and tables for organizations who support recovery. We are requesting use of Railroad Green from 10 am to 1 pm July 29, 2018 to allow time to set up, have the assembly and clean up. On the advice of TWPD, we are also requesting that Railroad Avenue be closed to vehicular traffic during that time. Participants will then be invited back to the Community Center to continue celebrating recovery.

We anticipate that we will have about 200 people participating in the Walk. Almost everyone's lives have been affected by addiction in some way. Whether it is you, a family member, significant other, friend, son or daughter, almost everyone's lives have been impacted in some way. The mission of "Break the Stigma" is to raise awareness by promoting transparency among individuals impacted by substance use disorder. Beginning right here within our own community and through the sharing of our own experiences, we hope to offer strength, wisdom, encouragement, support, guidance and resources to lay the foundation in promoting healthy coping strategies for all individuals, no matter how affected. "Break the Stigma" is a sub-committee of the Warwick Valley Prevention Coalition that works specifically to change the stigma of addiction recovery.

Insurance for the event will be provided by the Warwick Community Bandwagon, Inc., the fiscal agent for the Warwick Valley Prevention Coalition. Please let me know if there is anything else you need to review our request.


