<u>RESOLUTION CREATING A SPECIAL BOARD TO PREPARE AN UPDATE OF</u> <u>THE VILLAGE'S COMPREHENSIVE PLAN</u>

WHEREAS, the Village Board of the Village of Warwick has determined to undertake an

update of the Village's Comprehensive Plan; and

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WHEREAS, the Village Board wishes to create a special board tasked with preparation of a draft of the updated Comprehensive Plan pursuant to Village Law § 7-722(4);

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows:

1. That for purposes of preparing an update to the Village's Comprehensive Plan, the Village Board hereby creates a special board pursuant to Village Law § 7-722(4), which shall be called the "Village of Warwick Comprehensive Plan Committee" ("CPC"); and

2. The CPC shall consist of ten (10) members appointed by the Village Board. All members of the CPC must be Village residents and all members shall serve at the pleasure of the Village Board; and

3. Meetings of the CPC shall be conducted by a chairman appointed by the Village Board from among the ten CPC members. The CPC shall terminate and be dissolved upon the earlier of adoption of a resolution by the CPC approving a draft updated Comprehensive Plan for presentation to the Village Board or the adoption by the Village Board of a resolution dissolving the CPC; and

4. All CPC members shall serve as volunteers without compensation; and

5. The CPC shall meet at Village Hall on such dates and at such times as it may determine to be proper and convenient, subject to availability of the Village Hall on such dates and times. In the event that a venue for a CPC meeting other than Village Hall is required, the CPC may meet in a different location within the Village subject to approval of the Village Board. Meetings of the CPC shall be subject to the terms and provisions of the New York State Open Meetings Law; and Village of Warwick Board of Trustees February 18, 2020 Page Eight

6. The CPC shall have no designated budget but may request the Village Board to appropriate and provide funds for such expenditures as may be necessary to carry out its function. All such requests shall be in writing and include an itemized statement of the purposes for which the funds are being requested. All payments to vendors and/or contractors as approved by the Village Board shall be made through the Mayor's Office; and

7. Provided, however, that members of the CPC shall be reimbursed for personal expenditures they may incur on behalf of the CPC up to one hundred dollars (\$100) on any single occasion provided, however, that such expenditures must be approved in advance by the Mayor in writing. Members of the CPC shall be reimbursed for personal expenditures they may incur on behalf of the CPC over one hundred dollars (\$100) on any single occasion provided, however, that such expenditures must be approved in advance by the Village Board of Trustees by resolution. Members of the CPC shall not incur personal expenditures on behalf of the CPC which total in excess of \$500 either on any single occasion or in the aggregate over a thirty (30) day period; and

8. The Village Clerk is hereby directed to post notice at Village Hall and on the Village's website soliciting residents of the Village of Warwick to volunteer as candidates for the Comprehensive Plan Committee.

<u>Reports</u>

DPW Supervisor, Mike Moser's Report:

Since my last report the Village Department of Public Works has been working on the following projects and assignments:

- All Village owned properties are continuously maintained.
- All DigSafe 811 utility mark-outs performed.
- Infiltration investigation on-going, latest video showed/located major infiltration point in Homestead Village issue has been resolved. Other places are being investigated.
- Cold patching of potholes continues throughout the Village.
- Repaired water leak on High Street.
- Couple of snow and ice events were taken care of.
- Chipping project from storm damage finished. It took a tremendous amount of time, effort, and funding due to residents putting out excessive amounts of debris and not putting it out in the allotted time frame.
- Village owned properties still being worked on as time and weather permits.
- Leak detection program conducted throughout Village only showed few minor leaks that will be addressed in the coming weeks, overall system is in very good shape.
- Demolition and site prep work for ADA sidewalk project on High Street has begun.
- Working with Engineers on the new reservoir water storage tank project.
- Catch basin installed on Kennilworth to help with icing/drainage issue.
- Preliminary DPW budget submitted to Treasurer.
- Various other routine daily tasks have been performed.

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Trustee Cheney's Report:

Trustee Cheney mentioned the leak detection survey that was performed was in part funded through a grant from the Orange County Water Authority. It has been about five years since the last one was done, so it's good to see we are keeping things buttoned up. Past leak detection surveys have yielded considerably greater amounts of water that was being lost.

Trustee McManus' Report:

Trustee McManus requested that the DPW come up with a plan so they don't have to put the little bench in front of the Lion drinking fountain in Stanley Deming Park so kids can actually reach the fountain and still maintain the ADA requirements.

Mike Moser said as soon as they get back in the park in the springtime to do the pathway, it will have a little ramp up to the lion so it will be a gradual platform so kids can reach it.
