A Special Meeting of the Board of Trustees of the Village of Warwick was held on July 1, 2020 at 7:00 p.m. in Village Hall, 77 Main Street, Warwick, NY via Zoom Videoconference. Present was: Mayor, Michael J. Newhard, Trustees: Barry Cheney, William Lindberg, and George McManus. Trustee Eileen Patterson was absent. Also, present was: Village Clerk, Raina Abramson and Village Attorney, Stephen Gaba. Facility Use - Stanley-Deming Park, Chosun Taekwondo

Discussion

The Village Board had a lengthy discussion regarding the consideration of granting approvals of facility use applications pending insurance.

Final Comments from the Board -

Mayor Newhard stated that the street closure for the restaurants was very successful. Mayor Newhard thanked Village Clerk, Raina Abramson and Deputy Clerk, Maryann Benedict, the Department of Public Works and stated that they did an incredible job; Village Code Enforcement Officer, Boris Rudzinski and the Board members that came out and was a great force with careful observation. Mayor Newhard stated that he still believes that the Village must step up the campaign about wearing masks and social distancing and additional signage has been placed on the streets today. Mayor Newhard also said that the restaurants are extremely happy because they're able to make a profit, which they haven't in many, many months – the public has

received this very well. Mayor Newhard is thankful that the public understands that it is an inconvenience and that it won't last forever, and that these are the times that we are in and we have to be creative with some of these changes.

Mayor Newhard also stated that the restaurants have asked about some level of outdoor music such as acoustic guitars, one musician playing background music for the diners and asked for the Board's input. Trustee Lindberg felt that a one or two-person acoustic type of music standing in a place that would not form a crowd would be good and would add to the atmosphere. Trustee Cheney agreed but asked that the restaurants work with each other as to who is going to be there during what period of time. Trustee McManus agreed but also felt that each restaurant shouldn't have their own music, that it should be more centralized. Village Attorney, Stephen Gaba, reiterated that the Village must make sure that there is not a place of assembly around the musicians.
